Dear Parents and Carers,

Re. Reopening of Schools – January 2022

Happy New Year, we hope that you had a restful and enjoyable Christmas break and welcome you back to the new term.

As you will have seen and heard on the news COVID is still very much around especially the new Omicron variant.

We are continuing to employ all of our measures to mitigate against the spread of the virus including high levels of ventilation, careful monitoring the CO2 levels, LFT testing, good hand hygiene and cleaning. As we are heading into the coldest part of the winter, please ensure that your children are dressed for the cold, this may include extra layers including additional tops such as thermals and warm coats and hats to keep warm.

We are aware that as a possible wave of cases hits Somerset then we may struggle with staff absence due to self-isolation. As a result, we are ensuring that we do all we can to keep the classes open and are planning for covering staff if this should occur. However, in the worst case scenario if this proves too difficult and safety is compromised then we may have no option but to close classes.

Similarly if your child needs to self-isolate and they are feeling well then we will continue to set work remotely in line with our <u>procedures</u>.

The **isolation period** for individuals who test positive for COVID-19 has now been **reduced to 7 days** as long as negative LFD tests are done on day 6 and 7 of the self-isolation period.

If children do not have a high temperature, self-isolation can end after the second negative test result meaning individuals can **return to an education setting from day 7**, but please note that the Government are asking that LFD tests are also taken on **days 8, 9 and 10** for education settings.
