Y1 and 2 Reading

Our Reading Challenge

All children should have a reading book and a reading record with them in school every day.

It is important that reading records are looked after and that they are available for us to see.

As part of 'Our Reading Challenge' it is important that children read at home (preferably to an adult) at least 3 times a week. Every time your child reads a few pages, their reading record needs to be signed. If your child has 3 signatures by the end of the week they will receive 3 monster points. If they have read 5 times a week they will receive 5 monster points. These will be given on a Monday.

Children will also have a tricky words bookmark or common exception word mat that will be stuck inside their reading record. Please read and learn these words regularly.

YR Reading

YR children will have reading books later this term as and when they are ready. More information will follow nearer the time, including a Phonics information meeting in November.

<p><u>Y1 and 2 only</u> <u>Spelling tests</u></p>	<p>Children will be given a list of spellings to learn ready for a test on Thursdays. These are linked to The Spelling Shed which is an online site that includes games to practice the spellings for the week and build up scores and points.</p> <p>A spelling book can be sent home so your child can practice and write out their spellings during the week. This can stay at home and a second book will be kept at school to do their actual test in.</p>
<p><u>Y1 and 2 only</u> <u>Mathematics</u></p>	<p>Mental Maths Olympics is an activity we sometimes use in school for children to practice their Maths skills with a time limit set to record answers. Sheets may be sent home when needed as part of Homework activities.</p> <p>Mathletics and Numbots, please continue to encourage your child to practice their mathematical skills and both these online sites are great for doing this in a fun way.</p>
<p><u>YR, 1 and 2</u> <u>Homework Challenge</u></p>	<p>We would like all children to focus on their weekly spellings, practice Maths skills and reading up to 3 times a week.</p> <p>There will be optional challenge activities that you can choose to complete to gain more monster points. All information is on Google Classrooms.</p>
<p><u>YR, 1 and 2</u> <u>Extra Activities-</u> <u>Phonics/ SPAG/</u> <u>Maths</u></p>	<p>Sometimes there will be extra activities put on Google Classrooms where children can earn more monster points. These are all optional. These can also be handed in on Google Classrooms.</p>

Additional Information

Teaching Assistant

Mrs Lou White will be supporting Class 1 with their learning Mondays – Thursdays and Ms de la Hey on Fridays.

Everyday

Children will need to bring a coat, named water bottle and lunch/snack into school every day unless your child will be having school lunches. We would also recommend that YR children have a set of named spare clothes in a named bag on their peg. (These do not have to be school uniform)

PE

PE lessons will be on Fridays so please make sure your child comes dressed for PE on this day. They will not need to wear their usual school uniform but can bring it in a separate bag for if they need to get changed during the day for any reason. A jumper or cardigan and a change of footwear is still useful even if they don't have spare clothes for the rest of the day. Please ensure everything has your child's name on it.

Forest School

Forest school will be part of your child's Physical Education and Outdoor Learning on Tuesdays. The children will be going out in groups across the morning. Please can you ensure your child's wellies and a waterproof coat are in school on these days and have their name in them.

Monster Points

We run an award system called 'Class Dojo'. Each child is assigned a monster avatar and points are awarded for many reasons from showing kindness to tackling a challenge (with everything in between!). Last term we awarded karate belts as they earned their points. This term we have a reward wheel! When 25 points are achieved they can spin the wheel to claim a reward. One of these is the opportunity to 'Show and Tell'. This is an opportunity to share something special to them with the rest of the class.
