Highlights this half-term:

The schools have continued to participate in competitive sports this half-term with children competing in football matches, hockey events, netball tournaments and cross country fixtures. The Year 6 football team got a brilliant 3-1 win earlier in the month at Millfield. It was a confident team display with all players showing great determination. On the trip they learnt about the impact of Anti-Social Behaviour as well as finding out about the history of the prison. Class 2 at Norton enjoyed a visit to Longleat this week linked to their work on Rainforests. They had a great time especially feeding the lorikeets!

As things continue to open up, many pupils (and former pupils) have been involved in events out of school including the Norton Panto, Chinnock Crackers and the Helen Laxton Everybody Dance Performances. A huge well done to all children involved, as well as many others competing in sports and other activities out of school.

To continue the dancing theme, the West Chinnock PFA Disco took place a couple of weeks ago (thank you to the PFA and YO YO JO Disco for the music). Mr Caswell really enjoyed the conga!

Most of all, we are looking forward to celebrating Easter today with all the children that have worked so hard this term and hope as many of you as possible are able to join us for the parade and other events! Thank you to the FONS and PFA for their collaboration in making the Easter events possible.

Endurance:

We were delighted by news that Endurance, the lost vessel of Antarctic explorer Sir Ernest Shackleton, was found at the bottom of the Weddell Sea and children have enjoyed seeing the images of the ship still in good condition. What a way to bring the History Curriculum to life! Coincidentally, our half-termly core

value is ENDURANCE with children thinking about how to keep persevering even when the going gets tough, and to support and encourage others to keep going.

With high levels of staff absence this half-term, we are really proud that the schools have been able to keep things going despite the disruption. We have certainly seen our core value lived out in our schools by all members of the community. We thank our staff team for their ongoing resilience, parents for your understanding and the Governing Board for its ongoing support through the challenges we have faced. A huge well done to all the pupils for staying motivated, keeping going and coming into school ready to learn.

Fundraising and raising awareness:

The Readathon raised over £750. Well done to everyone who took part by reading, sponsoring readers and to Esther from the FONS for promoting the idea. This money will buy books for children in hospital as well as helping to increase our stock in school.

Pupils were keen to raise money for the Disasters Emergency Committee in support of the people of Ukraine. We held a non-uniform day with children coming into school in yellow and blue for the day. Between the schools, over £200 was raised.

The following week was Red Nose Day supporting Comic Relief for causes in the UK and abroad. A highlight of the day was at West Chinnock when volunteer Jonathan re-created a Monty Python comedy moment and the children climbed up a mountain across the playground! The event has resulting in some great story writing and we thank Jonathan for the inspiration.
